Course Description and Objectives

The Ethics and Religious Culture program offers all students from various backgrounds multiple opportunities to engage in issues of ethical and religious nature through discussions. Students will be exposed to various ethical issues and are encouraged to reflect and practice open-mindedness in order to develop critical reflection, while improving their ability to act appropriately with others. The ERC course aims to facilitate and

promote a dialogue about inclusivity, behaviour, reflexive thinking, tolerance and acceptance towards peoples' differences, while learning to respect others in order to become an integral part of society.

The Ethics and Religious Culture program will allow your child to:

- acquire or consolidate, if applicable, an understanding of how all individuals are equal in terms of right and dignity
- learn to reflect on issues
- explore, depending on his/her age, different ways in which Québec's religious heritage is present in his/her immediate or broader environment
- learn about elements of other religious traditions present in Québec
- grow and develop in a society in which different values and beliefs coexist
